

Acts 2:1-4 <sup>1</sup> When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sup>4</sup> All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Through the guidance and empower-

ment of the Holy Spirit those first ancestors in the Christian faith took steps into worship, witness, and welcome. Together they shared Jesus. And the world was changed!



addition, the program provides rental assistance and support services along with personalized services to help participants achieve self-identified goals.



# Pastor John, Notes from India & Tanzania

Greetings to my sponsoring churches! Last month when I wrote to you, I was on the road again with my colleague, Dr.

John Lunn, pastor and nurse, is international coordinator of the Lutheran Health Care Program in Tanzania and India, and we support his ministry as the Superior Central Conference of the North -ern Great Lakes Synod, ELCA.

Reena, from India and Dr. Paul from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. We were visiting cancer treatment centers around Tanzania. The Bugando Oncology Unit is definitely a program on the move and will be formidable in a year's time (or two). They are hoping to have their RT (radiation therapy) machines installed in June. They've been sitting outside the bunkers (name for the room where they put RT machines) for a while.

They've done an amazing job at obtaining and training the human resources that they need. They'll definitely be the premier treatment center in Tanzania when all is up and working. We spent time with the head of the department, who is a medical oncologist (trained in Italy), the radiation oncologist (who trained in India), and the pathologist (also trained in Italy). They have six nurses trained in oncology nursing as well as a surgeon, a pediatrician and several others in training. Very impressive.

Later on the trip, Dr. Reena and I went on a very nice safari, but it was a bit hot as the day went on, and the tsetse flies were particularly irritating! I'm glad they don't hang around other places I travel in Tanzania! (They are pesky, like MN deer flies.) The park is huge and we could go a long way without seeing animals. At first we saw impala and baboons, then a few warthogs and some giraffes, and even some ostriches. Once we saw one elephant, we kept seeing more and more elephants - big and small and all sizes in-between. We didn't see any zebra or wildebeest – except just outside the park on the highway! We learned that herds of impala had only one grown male with the females and the children/calves. When the male calf grows its horns, it is kicked out of the group and joins the bachelor group. We learned that a herd of elephants is led by the matriarch. Next in line, the eldest female. Our driver was pretty knowledgeable. It was good day, but it would have been nice to see more animals. It wasn't the right time of the year for that, and it's a huge park. Maybe the animals are at their summer homes?

I got to preach on Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday. On Palm Sunday, the Confirmation kids and Sunday School children processed in ahead of me, carrying palm fronds. Those palm fronds had very sharp tips, but with a little warning, the kids didn't injure anyone. My sermon was entitled "Replaced by Stones?" God's message will be heard!

And it is for everyone, and in the church we tend to silence too many voices. On Maundy Thursday, rather than actually washing the feet of a few people, I suggested that everyone imagine Jesus washing their feet while I read the Gospel. My sermon was about everyone being welcome at Jesus' table – no one is barred. Not Peter who will deny him. not the terrified disciples who would run away, not even Judas who would betray him, and not any of us.

At the Good Friday Service I attended, we were asked to nail a piece of paper to a cross – a piece of paper on which we'd written a sin or shortcoming – something we wanted to offer up to Jesus on the cross.

It was very effective for me. I preached on Easter Sunday too, but not on Easter Monday when Tanzanian churches have services.

I made the rounds of the hospitals I have been working with to do a last check on their needs and to say goodbye. There had been some rain and some of the formerly dust, bumpy dirt roads were now muddy, bumpy roads. It was good to have four-wheel drive. But when the trip was over I was done with Tanzanian back roads. Now I just have Liberian back roads to deal with!

It's been very hot in Vellore because it's summer, but that also means mango season, so the heat is worth dealing with if there are mangoes!? And I won't be escaping the heat any time soon – it will be hot and humid in Liberia too. I am getting ready to make visits to Kolkata and Padhar and then go directly to Liberia for almost two weeks, so packing is tricky, but it is a skill I have acquired with all the traveling I have been doing.

I'm just about done with this kind of traveling, but I will write again next month before transitioning back to Hawaii. Please continue to pray for me, and I will continue to keep you in my prayers.

# **Bob Lenz Coming Again this Fall**

You may remember Bob from four years ago when he came to Negaunee High School to lead school assemblies as well as an evening Christian outreach where there was standing room only in the auditori-



um? Bob is a dynamic, international speaker, author, and founder of Life Promotions (as in Lifest and Power of One) who does a wonderful job of connecting youth with hope. Well, the Negaunee Ministerial Association, along with other churches in Ishpeming and beyond, in cooperation with Negaunee and Ishpeming schools have invited Bob to return on October 3 & 4.

Bob and some gifted friends will lead daytime school assemblies for middle and high school student bodies on key life topics (e.g., bullying) and provide corresponding curriculum, both of which promise to keep separation of church and state. Additionally, they will invite youth back to the respective school auditoriums for evening events that will feature Christian outreach with the gospel of Jesus Christ to youth, parents, and all who wish.

There is much to do in preparation, including fundraising (over \$4,000 of this roughly \$8,500 commitment has already been raised), event volunteer coordination, and organization of postevent youth support from the church.
