NOT Inevitable

"Do you hear that, Mr. Anderson? That is the sound of inevitability." So says the key antagonist in the (classic?) film "The Matrix" as he holds the protagonist Neo to the subway tracks, both gazing at the approaching train cars. Have you ever felt like Neo, staring at the oncoming light of a train looming larger and larger in your reality? So what's inevitable? Your schedule? Lack of purpose and meaning? A relationship breakup? Surrender to addiction... again? A doctor's prognosis? The tyranny of aging? The postmodern distain of and disconnect from

As I write this I'm preparing to lead a study of the Reformation Day verses from the Gospel According to John. (Reformation Day, October 31, is the day when Martin Luther hung his 95 theses for debate, statements in which Luther challenged many of the heresies within the church that most had come to accept as inevitable.) John 8:31-32 reads: ³¹ Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." It's spoken to a people – including us! – caught in the inevitability of our own sinful-

"organized" Christian faith?

ness, the list in my first paragraph simply being expressions of that bondage. Yet Jesus offers an alternative to the inevitable in His grace of truth and freedom. Here, "truth" is God come to us in Christ Jesus our Lord, and "freedom" is not freedom to do what one sinfully wants (c.f., independence and au-

tonomy) but freedom from sin and death, being bound to an intimate relationship with God (as a child is intimately related to his/her parents and siblings).

Are you feeling bondage to what seems inevitable? Tap Jesus' gift. In the weekly gatherings of the body of Christ, we will remember, celebrate, and receive again God's truth and freedom in Jesus the Christ. God wants to free you...on Reformation Day with freedom from corrupt perspective...on All Saints' Day with freedom from death...during Advent with freedom from self-destructive

direction...during Christmas with freedom from being alone.... The truth and freedom of our Lord is good... both to receive and to share.

Now is the time to break free! Now is the time to gain freedom. Jesus Christ is His name. Come, gather, receive it and live it!

What do you get for someone who has everything? A Goat, or tree perhaps?




Through ELCA Good Gifts, we can help provide a family with independence and sustainability. Here's how it works.



They both teach music at Tumaini University Makumira and help to develop the department and various related projects. They work with pastors, church musicians and music educators, sharing the gifts they have and receiving the gifts from the church in Tanzania. They are amazed at how God has prepared them individually and as a family to do this work they love to do. As a conference we have committed at least \$2,000 annually to their ongoing mission.

November & December Mission Emphases

LOVE INC CUP, our area ecumenical caring ministry, is our November Mission Emphasis.

The mission of *Love In the Name of Christ* is to mobilize local churches to transform lives and communities In the Name of Christ. Together we are using our spiritual gifts, talents, skills, and finances to walk with and care for neighbors in need, giving a hand up, not a handout. Example: Someone in need of money for the laundromat was instead connected with someone who had a washing machine as well as coffee and conversation to share.

This month's mission emphasis offering, will specifically go toward the behind-the-scenes expenses of coordinating our Christian care (i.e., Love INC CUP office space rental & supplies as well as salary for Love INC CUP part-time executive director, Fiona Banfield, and the Clearinghouse coordination). Although Love INC CUP has temporarily been closed to new requests during a change of staff and mission refocusing, its doors will again soon be open.

If you wish to give to Love INC CUP, please use November's mission emphasis envelope from your offering envelopes box or in some other way designate your gift. Remember also that Love INC CUP is you and me, the church. Please consider donating time to care for a neighbor with the gifts God has placed under your management. Thank you for your generosity!



Room at the Inn, our area emergency night shelter for adults, is our December Mission Emphasis. Run by a coalition of churches sharing the mission to provide support

and shelter for the homeless in the Marquette area, Room at the Inn doesn't house guests in one place, but rotates the shelter, moving weekly to one of the twelve different hosting churches. The shelter is run and staffed by volunteers and funded by contributions from the community.

Room at the Inn's Warming Center (across from the Ramada in Marquette) provides additional care through a warm and friendly location during mornings for shelter guests to gather, socialize, and – of

course! – warm up during cold times. The weekly host church has use of the Warming Center to serve as a morning shelter location. Guests can also use its shower facility.

The underlying goal of Room at the Inn is to provide an opportunity for guests to focus on life transitions without the worry of finding food and shelter. Room at the Inn serves Marquette area residents but will consider referrals from neighboring social service agencies on a case-to-case basis.

LAY SCHOOL NEWS Fall 2016

The Fall Semester still has courses that are available in November. Classes continue to meet each Tuesday until November 29th (except for Thanksgiving week, November 22nd).



Classes meet at Messiah, Marquette (305 W. Magnetic) with Pastor Warren Geier as the site coordinator. The location represents a change which will hopefully make it easier for people in the Marquette area to participate without inconveniencing others too much

The final class for this fall is the following:

Prophets I/Isaiah and Jeremiah
 November 1st to November 29th (3-6pm) (4 sessions)

 An introduction to Old Testament prophetic material

including the former and latter prophets. This class will focus on Isaiah and Jeremiah as the most frequently cited lectionary prophets. (Pastor Ann Gonyea)

A reminder that as always there is no tuition; the only cost is for books (instructors do the best they can to keep that within reason.)

As is always the case, we need new students! It should be emphasized though that one does not have to sign up for nor even complete all the classes that are offered in Lay School. You can take as much or as little as works for your schedule and your interests. The program is designed to be flexible. Also, Lay School is not designed to produce Licensed Lay Ministers. While that is a possibility and some graduates have gone in that direction, most students are just interested in growing in faith and becoming more active in their own congregations.

To register for this last fall class, or if you have specific questions, contact your pastor or Pastor Geier (486-4351; pastor@bethany ishpeming.org). Students order books from the bookseller of their choice. Used books are often available at very low prices. If you would like more detailed information on this class contact Pastor Geier.

It would be great to have some new students give Lay School a try, so consider this a personal invitation! If you're not sure, try a course and see how it goes. You will grow in faith and you and your church will benefit from your involvement!



Sundays with Luther

Join the Lutheran catechism conversation Sundays at 10:00 in the Youth Room. Why? In the following introduction to his Large Catechism, Martin Luther convicted me. How

about you?

...each morning, and whenever else I have time, I do as a child who is being taught the catechism and I read and recite word for word the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Psalms, etc. I must still read and study the catechism daily, and yet I cannot master it as I wish, but must remain a child and pupil of the catechism—and I also do so gladly.... What [people] need, however, is to become children and begin to learn the ABCs, which they think they have long since outgrown.

Therefore, I beg such lazy bellies and presumptuous saints, for God's sake, to let themselves be convinced and believe that they are not really and truly such learned and exalted doctors as they think. I implore them not ever to imagine that they have learned these parts of the catechism perfectly, or that they know them sufficiently, even though they think they know them ever so well. Even if their knowledge of the catechism were perfect (although that is impossible in this life), yet it is highly profitable and fruitful to read it daily and to make it the subject of meditation and conversation. In such reading, conversation, and meditation the Holy Spirit is present and bestows ever new and greater light and devotion, so that it tastes better and better and is digested, as Christ also promises....




