Connecting to Each Other

There are many metaphors that describe a con-

ble web of supportive relationships of which I

am a part within the body of Christ – with God, others, and you. Together we live, love, laugh, cry, hold, serve, grow up and witness.

As with any family, *faith families* also come with their share of challenges, including staying connected to one another amidst very busy lives. Days, weeks, and months can go by without spending quality time with one another.

So how can we as a *faith family* connect and continuously reconnect? Pastor Marcia and I like to take our daughters on family vacations, traveling and camping, away from the pressures of everyday, work-a-day schedules. Of course, going on a road trip as a congregation probably isn't very practical. It would be hard to fit us all into one car!

So how can we as a *faith family* connect and continuously reconnect? Let's brainstorm and experiment. I bet we can come up with some quality ideas, both corporate and individual. How about trying out one of these?

- Pray for each other.
- Gather for worship AND stay or come early for Sunday coffee time.
- Try sitting in a new place at gatherings like worship and coffee time, starting a conversation with "new" neighbors.
- When in conversation, ask simple questions that help you to get to know someone else.
- Join a small group Bible study, service project, or ministry team, building relationships.
- Invite a fellow Immanuel disciple you don't know very well to dinner.
- Participate in (and perhaps even plan) a fun event. (I heard talk of a summer BBQ at council.)
- Send a birthday or anniversary card to someone from the listing in the Beacon.
- Connect with a Thrivent member to form an action team that does something good for someone else, tapping Thrivent's Action Team Grant (see *Thrivent Action Team* article in this Beacon)

What are some idea you have to connect and reconnect to other sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus here at Immanuel? Let's get creative and experiment! Also stay tuned for ideas that council is

Sunday School Report for May / June Beacon

Our Sunday School mission is to nourish the children's faith through Bible stories. Faith is a gift from God. Faith comes from hearing God's word and grows when we hear stories of God's



love and promises that God keeps. Faith allows us to rely on God to take care of us, helps us to love God and other people. During the opening I give the children the main focus of the story, but tell them to listen to the Bible story to find out what happens. I am going to give you this same opportunity in this article.

Children learned about two kinds of stories- Miracles and Parables.

- Jesus used miracles- events that could only happen through the power of God- to catch peoples' attention so they would be ready to see the and hear God's message.
- Jesus used parables- to teach about God's love. He used unexpected elements to get people to look at life differently. The parables were more difficult for us to understand because we are not familiar with the elements of the culture, language and customs of Jesus time. It took extra explaining, but we did look at life differently because of the stories.

We told these miracle stories:

- God used his power over the fish created on Day 5 to increase the faith of Peter. Peter, the fisherman, fished all night but had not catch any fish. He was not sure he wanted to take fishing advice from a carpenter- Jesus. Read the story in Luke 5:1-11 to see what happened to Peter's faith when he did rely on Jesus.
- Jesus knew he had God's power. A Roman Centurion sent word to Jesus asking him to use that power. Read Luke 7:1-10 to see what amazed Jesus. Hint: Romans did not worship God.
- God revealed his power to Peter again, this time using the water he had created on Day 2. Jesus walked on that water to get to the boat. Read Matthew 14:23-33 to see what happens when Peter's faith is strong, and when Peter begins to worry about worldly things- wind and waves.
- We told the story of the most AWESOME miracle- the Easter story of Palm Sunday, Jesus' Crucifixion and Resurrection from the Gospel of John, chapters 18, 19 and 20.

We told the parable story about God loving us so much that he sent Jesus to find us. Read Luke 15:1-7 to see what unexpected things Jesus told to the Pharisees. (We learned that sheep and shepherds were very low class in Jesus' time and the Pharisees thought themselves to be very high class.)

We told three more parable stories where Jesus used unexpected ways to teach us that praying and spending time with God are the most important parts of our lives.

- We learned that hospitality is important, but read Luke 10:38-1. 43 to find out the unexpected advice Jesus gives to two sisters.
- We learned that sharing is important. Read Mark 12:38-44 to 2. see who Jesus uses to teach that HOW we share is more important than how MUCH we share. The children learned that although they do not yet have money treasures to share, they do have treasure that can be shared happily-hugs, encouraging words, prayers, God's Good News of salvation
- Jesus used birds and flowers to help people look at life 3. differently. Read Matthew 6:24-34 to see what Jesus taught the people what to do instead of worrying.

In May, our mission emphasis is Lutheran Social Services'

Welcome Home ministry. Welcome Home helps individuals and families in Marquette and Alger counties make the transition from homelessness to safe, secure and permanent housing. In addition, the program



provides rental assistance and support services along with personalized services to help participants achieve selfidentified goals.

The Voices for Youth Program is closed because of budget cuts. The Transitional Living Program provides similar services for youth between ages 16 and 21 in our area.

<u>In June</u>, we focus on *Answer the Call*, an offering toward development of future pastors in our Northern Great Lakes Synod (NGLS).

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and its predecessor church bodies have a long history of theological education for pastors and other rostered persons who serve this church in



ministries of Word and Sacrament. Your synod is asking you to share a financial gift with our synod seminarians.

Seminary education costs continue to increase with tuition, books, room and board expenses now totaling about \$30,000 per year for the three-year Masters of Divinity program in our seminaries. The average debt load of a new pastor graduating in 2016 with debt from our seminaries (70% of all graduates) and beginning her or his ministry will exceed \$40,000. Our goal as a Synod is to fund full tuition scholarships for our students studying for the pastoral ministry.
