Though faith itself is a gift from God through the Holy Spirit, discipleship is something we must intentionally pursue in response. Furthermore, our faith formation as disciples of Christ needs to be holistic (*Will There Be Faith*, Thomas Groome, 2011, p. 111-119):

- A way of the head (inform) demands a discipleship seeking understanding and belief with personal conviction through study, reflecting, discerning, deciding.
- A way of the heart (form) demands a discipleship of right relationship and right desires, community building, hospitality and inclusion, trust in God's love, prayer and worship.
- A way of the hands (transform) demands a discipleship of love, justice, peacemaking, simplicity, integrity, healing, and repentance.

As we come into this fall, I call you once again to renew pursuit of your personal discipleship. Experiment with growing through the opportunities mentioned in this Beacon and beyond. Experiment with the faith formation resources that will become available via our church website. If something doesn't help, try something else...or let's talk about how you and "it" can better connect, thinking through the details. ¹²...so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ....

²¹ When you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus.
²² You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be made new in the attitude of your minds;
²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

Immanuel received just over \$40,000 from Barbara Lehtonen's estate. Although there were no binding stipulations, council desired to honor Barbara's ideas by endorsing use toward technology that empowers worship & education, new floor covering for the lower level Sunday School area, building debt retirement, and contribution to Immanuel's Endowment Fund. Council is forming two teams – tech and floor covering – that will develop specific proposals for congregational approval at the next annual meeting. A Vacation Bible School Report

Once again, Vacation Bible School (VBS) has come and gone for another year. *"Maker Fun Factory"* VBS was hosted at **St. Paul Catholic Church** at 202 W. Case St., Negaunee. At <u>Maker Fun</u> <u>Factory</u> kids embarked on a VBS adventure that traveled through field-tested rotations that reinforced relevant Bible points and immersed kids in new adventures. The Bible content & Buddies showed how kids experience God's Word. At <u>Maker Fun Factory</u>, one memorable Bible Point was reinforced each day. For example on Day 1, kids met Decker, the Decoration Crab where they learned that "God made you," related to Psalm 139:14, and Gen-

esis 1:26-24, plus a Bible story. Then, on Day 2 they met Tina, the Cathedral termite where they learned *"God is for you,"* related to Romans 8:31 and Joshua 1-2, plus a Bible story. On Days 3, 4, & 5, they met Bubba, Skylar, & Abbee. It was exciting. They started the day together, sang a





fun mix of memorable worship & praise songs echoing Bible truths. Leaders made it easy for kids to remember & apply to real life what they learned! Kids experienced God's Word in surprising and unforgettable ways!

Our new Bishop-Elect is Pastor Katherine Finegan.

The Rev. Katherine A. Finegan was elected May 23, 2017, to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Northern Great Lakes Synod, ELCA. The election was held during the Syn-

od Assembly which took place at Messiah Lutheran Church and Northern Michigan University in Marquette, MI, on May 21-23. Bishop Tom Skrenes will retire as of September 1, at which time Pastor Katherine will assume that ministry.

Pastor Katherine has served as Assistant to the Bishop in the NGLS since February, 2012. Previously she served as pastor of Bethany Lutheran Church in Republic, MI, from 2002-2012, and as Youth Minister at Hope Lutheran Church in St. Paul, MN, from 1988-2000. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, IN, in 1987, and received her Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, in 2002.

Pastor Katherine will be installed as the fourth bishop of the Northern Great Lakes Synod on Saturday, **October 21st**, **at 1:30 p.m**. at St. Peter's Cathedral in Marquette. A reception will immediately follow at the Holiday Inn from 3:00-5:30 p.m. All are welcome to attend both the installation service and reception.

PRISON MINISTRY NEWS

KERYX 48, OCTOBER 19-22, 2017

Fellow Members of Immanuel, Once again, a team of 25 Christian men who will be conducting a KERYX weekend



for a group on inmates at the Marquette Branch Prison, October 19-22. KEREX 48 is similar to the CURSILLO, Emmaus, and Via de Christo programs and is adapted to the prison environment. It is a condensed, life-changing course in Christianity offered to 24 new inmates every 6 months.

We will begin Thursday afternoon and continue until Sunday afternoon. The team will spend the nights at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church where breakfast is also provided at 5:30 am. We join the inmates for our other meals.

I am requesting your support in two ways:

- We will need cookies for the correction officers and prison staff as a reward and incentive for all of the additional responsibilities created by our program.
- 2. We need our congregation's prayer support that the Holy Spirit will open the minds & hearts of the inmates so that they may more fully receive and accept the Lord Jesus in their lives. Also, prayers that the team will effectively reflect God's love for these inmates. A prayer vigil will be in progress during the duration of the weekend, along with support from similar groups worldwide.

Sign-up sheets for the prayer vigil will be passed out during the coffee-time and then available on the bulletin board outside the Office. Cookies can be put in a disposable container in the kitchen, labeled "**Prison**". They need to be ready for pick-up by noon on Thursday, <u>October 19</u>.

Faith is a gift from God that deepens as we "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18)



All lessons are being designed here at Immanuel to:

- utilize the strengths of our Congregation
- help students and families know more about our Lord and Savior and so grow in faith.

In the first quarter lessons will focus on Holy Communion, Worship and a short unit on Luther and the Reformation. Old Testament lessons will bring us up to Advent and Christmas. The afternoon classes will continue to be held on

Tuesdays beginning on September 5th. The tentative ending date is November 28th but Halloween and weather could push things to December 5th. Classes will not meet during Thanksgiving week.

*** The big change is that the evening classes will be moved to Wednesday. For the first three weeks class will begin at 6 pm and go until 8:30. In late September the classes will become part of Messiah's Wednesday Night Life program. The WNL program begins with a meal at 5:30 pm followed by a Vespers service at 6. Lay School classes would then begin at 6:30 and go until 8:30. Lay School participants are invited to come for the meal and/or worship as well as the evening's class.

Classes will be held at Messiah, Marquette (305 W. Magnetic) with Pastor Warren Geier (Bethany, Ishpeming) as the site coordinator.

Four classes will be offered in the Fall 2017 semester. Early Church History and Worship and Liturgics on Tuesdays, Gospels and World Religions on Wednesdays. (please note the dates and times for each class as they do vary)

- Early Church History Tuesdays, Sept 5th to Oct 10th (3-5:30pm) (6 sessions) This class will focus on the development of the early church and the issues that led to the Seven Ecumenical Councils out of which most of our basic theology comes. The development of the Bible, the Nicene Creed and other doctrines concerning Jesus will be examined. (Pastor Warren Geier)
- total) An examination of the four gospels exploring the common message presented by the four evangelists, but also the unique aspects of each work. (Pastor Allan Johnson)
- Worship and Liturgics Tuesdays, Oct 17th to Nov 28th (3-5:30) (6 sessions) This class will focus on leading worship (why we do what do) and also on understanding the symbols we use, the church calendar, and the liturgical structure of worship. (instructor TBA)
- World Religions Wednesdays, Oct 25th to Nov 29th (6:30-8:30pm) (5 sessions) An overview of the essentials of the Christian faith and then a comparison with other religions of the world including Judaism, Islam and Buddhism. The hope is to have practitioners of other religions speak about their faith (Instructors TBA)

The Tuesday/Wednesday format does represent a significant change but it seems like it's worth a try for the fall semester. We'll evaluate as we go.

A reminder that there is no tuition; the only cost is for books (and instructors do their best to keep that within reason.)

As is always the case, we need new students! It should be emphasized though that one does not have to sign up for all the classes, one does not have to complete all the classes in a certain period of time, one does not even have to complete all the classes ever. You can take as much or as little as works (continued next column......)

for your schedule and your interests. The program is designed to be flexible. Also, Lay School is not designed to produce Licensed Lay Ministers. SUNDAY SCHOOL BIBLES

Martin Luther was very adamant that all people have access to the scriptures. He worked to translate the Bible into the common German language so all families could read and understand the Bible.

So, another Sunday School change is that all children will have access to the scriptures in an age appropriate book! In the past, there have been several different Bibles and Bible Storybooks in use across the grades. Some classes used a Bible Storybook that was big, heavy, and expensive. The teacher read the story, but there were only a few books to share among the students. This Storybook did not support beginning readers. Some- such as the Spark NRSV which we had been using-has a High School reading level. The Good News Bible is easy to read translation, but the ideas from the original texts are not as easy to understand.

Our Committee made a selection from a variety of books available. None of the books were perfect for every use, but we made choices based on accurate presentation of the scripture message, readability, kid appeal and cost. So:

- Students Preschool through Grade 2 will use The Beginners Bible, written for ages 4-8. This book does not present the whole Bible, but introduces children to the major characters and stories of God's plan for his people. There is a short text on each page with an illustration to show the characters, action & setting. The pictures match the story, so younger students can use the pictures to know what is happening in the story. Beginning readers can use the pictures to help them read the words.
- Grades 3-5 will each have Extreme Faith, Contemporary English Version. It is a complete Bible with idea to idea translation rather than a strict word for word translation. It is written to be easier to read and listen to without misunderstanding. It has an early 5th grade reading level.
